

Devizes Community Area Plan 2010

1. DCAP Culture & Leisure Group – Doug Roseman

A thriving leisure and cultural environment brings a community together.

Devizes is fortunate to have a cinema, an extensive leisure centre, two Museums and a permanent theatre. In addition Carnivals, Festivals and many other events are held throughout the area. The Town, Villages and countryside all share history going back millennia. There is an extensive network of sports clubs providing access to a wide range of physical activities. The whole area can be seen as a visitor attraction and is an ideal base for tourists. Promotion of tourism will help generate employment, income and sustainability of community facilities.

Most of the provision in the field of culture and leisure is in the hands of a large number of individual, and often small, voluntary groups. Such community involvement is a great strength but it is also a weakness as provision is reliant on a small number of people who are often involved in running many different organisations. Similarly funding is often dependent on the same generous donors.

There is a need to improve leisure, sporting, arts, community and cultural facilities and provision throughout the Community Area. Access to centralized services for those living in the villages needs to be improved.

Given the extensive reliance on volunteers we need to encourage community involvement and volunteering, particularly among young people.

2. DCAP Refreshed Economic Strategy – April 2010 – Mitch Roberts

Devizes is the economic, retail and cultural centre for the Community Area. Whilst remaining an unspoilt market town, there is a need in Devizes, for more and better retail shopping, new employment opportunities and promotion of the town and its Community Area as a centre for tourism. All of these opportunities should be embodied within any Master Plan.

1 Produce a Town Plan – Identify employment sites and other business opportunities, to establish best use of available land.

Partners – Mid Wilts Economic Partnership (MWEPP) - Devizes Town Council – Devizes Development Partnership (DDP)

Timescale – Inaugural meeting has taken place, in Jan 2010– MWEPP and Town Clerk, with DDP formally supporting the proposal

Outputs – The Town Plan should be attached to the LDF, to be used as supplementary planning guidance, thereby protecting identified sites from possible residential development or importantly, edge of town retail, which could impact upon the town centre retail viability.

2 Improve the public realm in the town centre.

Partners – Devizes Development Partnership (DDP) – Devizes Town Council – Wiltshire Council

Timescale – Consultation has taken place throughout 2008/9, to ascertain the level of support for improvements to be carried out in The Brittox and Little Brittox.

A Design Brief, based upon the consultation feedback, will be presented to the Devizes Area Board for their approval and subsequent submission to Wiltshire Council Executive for their consideration – Mid 2010

Outputs - This will encourage landlords to invest in their own property, which in turn, will attract further inward investment, by national retailers and hospitality sector representatives.

3 Continue to fund a Town Centre Manager

Partners – Devizes Development Partnership (DDP) – Devizes Town Council – Wiltshire Council.

Timescale – Funding is in place for 2010/11, but there is no confirmation of continued funding from Wiltshire Council, following the demise of Kennet District Council

Outputs – The Town Centre Manager will continue to deliver the objectives within the DDP Strategic Action Plan, which complements the DCAP Strategic Action Plan.

4 Monitor Key Performance Indicators, (KPI's). Footfall Counts, Car Park Turnover, Business Occupancy Levels, Planning Applications, On Street Consumer Surveys, etc.

Partners – DDP - Chamber of Commerce – Mid Wilts Economic Partnership – Wiltshire Council – Devizes Area Board – Business Link – Federation of Small Business (FSB)

Timescale – Ongoing

Outputs – Trends can be monitored and any negative aspects brought to the attention of town centre stakeholders. This activity will be financially supported by MWEPP, under the banner of Association of Market Towns (AMT) Benchmarking.

5 Tourism – Establish a Devizes District Tourism Group and nurture all tourism opportunities, to boost the local economy.

Partners – Wiltshire Council – DDP – Visit Wiltshire – Devizes Town Council, Kennet & Avon Canal Trust – Wadworth Brewery

Timescale – Group established in March 2010, with meetings ongoing.

Outputs – The focus is, Visit Devizes for a day, aimed at coach operators. The group is also identifying any shortfalls in visitor provision, public toilets, coach drop off / pick up points, etc

6 Plain Action – Identify opportunities to deliver the following aspirations, utilizing available regional funding.

- Strengthen the long term economic performance of the area, by supporting initiatives that nurture enterprise, cross sectors and remove barriers.

- Work for cohesive, stable and sustainable communities throughout the area, by addressing current imbalances and geographical and social isolation.
- Maximize the skills, abilities and opportunities of all those living and seeking work in the area, particularly in the context of the opportunities presented by the military establishment and the skills of those leaving it.

Partners – DCAP – Plain Action Management Group – DDP – Wiltshire Council

Timescale – 2006 until 2013

Outputs – This Rural Development Programme will improve life for those living and working on and around Salisbury Plain, including Devizes and its hinterland.

7 Support and promote local food producers, whilst developing links between producers and consumers.

Partners – DDP – Wiltshire Council

Timescale – Ongoing

Outputs – Maintenance of farmers markets, charter markets, food festival, etc.

8 Retain village shops, post offices, where possible and identify any alternate use for pub closures.

Partners – Appropriate Parish Council – DDP

Timescale – Ongoing

Outputs – Retain village retail floor space and where possible introduce a change of use for redundant public houses

9 Website. www.devizes.org.uk Build on the newly created site.

Partners – DDP - Devizes Tourism Group – Chamber of Commerce – Wadworth Brewery – Kennet & Avon Canal Trust

Timescale – Ongoing

Outputs – Global awareness of the town's assets, which should encourage increased visitor numbers.

10 Broadband Provision. Support and explore means, to offer Broadband throughout the Community Area.

Partners – DDP - Chamber of Commerce – Wiltshire Council – MWEP – Other Business Support Agencies

Timescale – Ongoing

Outputs – Encouragement of new business to our Community Area

11 Provision of starter units and other work places, to create employment opportunities for all.

Partners – Wiltshire Council – Chamber of Commerce – DDP

Timescale – Ongoing

Outputs – Work places, including starter units, provided for all ages of employees.

3. DCAP Housing & the Built Environment – Refreshed Strategy April 2010 – Janet Giles

Housing & the Built Environment has a link with most of the other thematic groups. Through good housing & infrastructure, the health, wellbeing & economy of the town can thrive.

The group consider that we are now at a point where radical new thinking is called for. There is an ever widening gulf between those who can manage to obtain a mortgage & purchase their home & those who are able to access rented or social housing.

The different needs of all residents have to be considered, with houses built to address these & with less money now available. More than ever developments should be looked at as a whole & integrate well into their surroundings.

(1) Neighbourhood cohesion - To bring people together, to improve their neighbourhoods and engender pride in their surroundings. Specifically, initially, to revitalise The Avenues area of the town, working together with Devizes Town Council and our housing association partners, to achieve this.

Partners – Devizes Town Council – Residents within The Avenues – Housing Association - Police

Timescale – Inaugural meetings have taken place with the Town Council, further action will take place throughout 2010. The initiatives put into place to deliver the objective will be subject to ongoing monitoring and development where necessary

Outputs – Community spirit will be engendered. The initiative will embrace those residents, within both private and affordable homes, thereby integrating them. The area will become more attractive which, in turn, will deter untoward activity

(2) Design and Community Consultation Supplementary Planning Guidance - To change the planning process, so that local requirements for design, infrastructure, open spaces and landscaping could be developed by the community, to inform local government.

There should be a requirement to consult the community on design, prior to a planning application being made with the provision of infrastructure of paramount importance.

Partners – Wiltshire Council Planning Department – Devizes Town Council – Housing Developers – Police Architectural Liaison Department (Security by Design) – Housing Associations

Timescale – Ongoing, for any significant residential development

Outputs - Local preferences for style, design & layout can be consulted on by the community at the initial stage of any development.

(3) Work with Housing Associations to meet the housing needs of all the community - Limited availability of land & financial restriction necessitates greater cooperation to make sure that houses are built for the need of all the community.

A more flexible approach to planning and viability needs to be taken working with our partners to achieve this. This could be in the renovation of existing tired estates or garage areas and identified redundant commercial sites, together with town centre regeneration through flats over shops.

In our villages, infill development should be encouraged and prioritised. At the same time, communities should be consulted, to identify possible sites for development to encourage local employment.

Partners – All Housing Associations – Local residents – Wiltshire Council – Devizes Town Council

Timescale- Ongoing

Outputs - Housing Associations do meet together already, but more could be done.

- By networking, when seeking compromise or innovative solutions, directly linked with adding value to any potential employment or residential sites
- Enhanced employment and health benefits
- Community involvement by consultation processes to identify possible sites

4. DCAP Transport – Tony Sedgewick

The high levels of traffic in the area is a cause for concern. In Devizes in particular it poses a threat to public health through pollution; it has an impact on local trade; it is a deterrent to new business and it disproportionately increases the area's carbon footprint.

Public Transport services are poor, increasing car-dependency and seriously disadvantaging those who, for whatever reason, do not have access to personal transport.

The committee accepts that any major improvements in the highway network is unlikely and is therefore aiming to reduce traffic levels by a series of practical and inexpensive actions.

5. Health & Social Care – Councillor Paula Winchcombe

Devizes has a wide range of health services. Increasing demand on those services cannot always be met by statutory providers, hence the development of an Independent Sector Treatment Centre at Marshall Road, Devizes, providing elective day surgery for residents of Wiltshire. In updating this section of the Community Area Plan the thematic group seeks to address local health and social care issues within the Devizes Community Area by linking to Local Area Agreements and the Joint Strategic Needs Assessment to identify and deliver projects to further improve the health and wellbeing of the community.

6. Crime and Community Protection – Noel Woolrych

Statistically Wiltshire is one of the safest places in the country and crime recorded crime has been falling at a steady rate. Within the Devizes Community Area crime has fallen even more. The Devizes Community Area Safety Committee works with many local agencies such as Wiltshire Council, Town and Parish Council, the Police, and representatives from local community and business organisations to maintain these low levels of crime and where possible to reduce them still further.

The committee's work also extends to the wider agenda of community safety linked to such issues as "fear of crime", preventative measures, including tackling the social causes of crime, social inclusion, rural deprivation and the promotion of independence through community based work and consultation.

Recent consultations revealed that the main concerns of the community were identified as domestic violence, youth issues, drug and alcohol misuse, burglary, vehicle and town centre crime, road safety, anti-social behaviour and crimes against vulnerable people.

7. DCAP Countryside and Land based Group - Ted East

The Group has focussed on the Kennet and Avon Canal area as the key to improving leisure amenities and access to the countryside. The British Waterways role locally has been taken over by the Kennet and Avon Canal Trust, a voluntary organisation. The Kennet and Avon Canal Trust wishes to redevelop their property at the Wharf to provide better public and youth facilities, including a café, toilets, meeting rooms and storage. The Group has been assisting the Trust to develop specific proposals and DCAP has agreed to adopt the project in principle. Plain Action has been introduced to the Trust and now requires a detailed project proposal so that funding can be earmarked.

The Group led an anti-litter campaign which concluded with a successful schools poster competition in partnership with Wiltshire Wildlife Trust. Local primary schools organised litter collections on their own premises. Volunteer litter collections along the Kennet and Avon canal were also supported.

There is a lack of public open space in Devizes following two decades of intensive housing development. Infrastructure planning has been neglected and new recreational open space in and close to the town is needed to replace that used up for housing. The existing public open spaces, such as the Wharf and Quakers Walk should be preserved and protected from further housing developments. The Wharf Centre proposal described above is the initial focus of this project. New public park areas should be identified and protected within the Wiltshire planning framework. For example, the undeveloped land to the west of Quakers Walk could be designated as future public parkland protected from development. In that way a continuous stretch of open space from the Caen Hill locks, through the Wharf to Quakers walk and beyond would remain accessible for recreation and enhance the town's amenities. These ambitions need to be incorporated in the Wiltshire Council's planning strategies. The Trust for Devizes and wide range of people with community interests is actively co-operating with the pursuit of these ambitions. The objective is to work alongside Wiltshire Councillors and Officers to encourage them to promote the wider amenity interests of the local community.

Recycling of waste from households needs to be improved. The kerbside collections are too limited and too many people are making trips by car to the recycling centres to dispose of cardboard, plastics, textiles, metals, electronic goods, etc. that cannot currently be put into the recycling collections and which they do not want to put into the land-fill general waste. Some of this material may be illegally dumped. This is not a problem that will be simple to solve but people should be encouraged to come forward with constructive ideas.

Other local organisations and individuals who have been supportive in the work of the Group include Wiltshire Council waste management and footpaths officers, Devizes Town Council officers, the neighbourhood police team and the Town Centre Manager.
